

Major research agenda of KWDI in 2013 and future plans

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KWDI has determined four principle policy targets for research for 2013 as follows: the actualization of practical gender mainstreaming in the financial and legal aspects of the government's endeavors; support for the diverse forms of families emerging due to accelerated social evolution; support for the employment and competency development of underprivileged women; and the promotion of social cohesion by further securing women's human rights and heightening awareness of gender equality issues.

As to the actualization of practical gender mainstreaming in the government's financial and legal efforts, related research will include the strengthening of gender impact assessment as a means to develop and expand gender-sensitive policies; the stable implementation and continued development of gender-sensitive budgeting; the production and use of gender-sensitive statistics aiming for gender mainstreaming; and the enhancement of gender mainstreaming in the legal sector and promotion of legislation related to women's and family issues.

Regarding support for the diverse types of families emerging as a result of rapid social change, research subjects include the development of family policies in response to future changes in the family such as a simplifying family structure, diversifying family forms, and multiculturalization, as well as measures to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of existing policies.

Research subjects related to support for the employment and competency development of underprivileged women feature the expansion of training and employment welfare, as well as to measures to reduce the polarization of jobs for women through quality-quantity balance in employment.

Finally, research regarding the promotion of social cohesion by further securing women's human rights and raising awareness of gender equality is to include the elimination of sexual violence-

prone blind spots within the protective structures, promotion of women’s human rights and safety, spread of gender-sensitive culture aiming to enhance the effectiveness of gender equality programs, and establishment of a gender-sensitive welfare regime.

In accordance with this framework, a total of 30 research projects, including basic and general projects and approximately 15 short-term irregular projects responding to current policy issues in 2013 will be pursued. In addition, KWDI is expected to undertake somewhere around 60 projects commissioned by government ministries and institutions including the Ministry of Gender Equality and Family. Among these, eight core projects have been selected as follows:

- Analysis and evaluation of gender budgeting in central and local governments (III)
- Gender-sensitive analysis of women- and family-related legal precedents and enactment agenda (II): family-related precedents
- Housing status of female-headed households and related policy measures, with a focus on unmarried one-person households and low-income single-parent households in urban areas
- The future of the family and projections for women and family policies (III)
- Policy agenda for productive lives by elderly women in an era of centenarians: integration of learning, work, and leisure
- Measures to increase the proportion of female employees at small- and mid-sized companies and support utilization of female resources by such companies
- Creation of a safe community environment for female children and adults (V): review of policies related to the safety of female children and adults and future agenda
- Research on proactive measures for the actualization of equality in South Korea
